

Lunch and a Movie Monday, 7/8 starting at 12pm Fiddler On The Roof (1971)


The first of two musicals from the late director Norman Jewison, this acclaimed film version adapts the equally beloved Broadway show. Based on Sholem Aleichem's "Tevye the Dairyman" stories, the show introduces us to the Jewish village of Anatevka, in turn-of-thetwentieth-century Ukraine. Tevye (Chaim Topol), a poor milkman, is doing his best to provide for his wife and five daughters. He takes strength from his devotion to God (with Whom he often has one-sided conversations) and the traditions that have upheld his people for centuries. But the world is changing, inside and outside Anatevka. Tevye finds himself thrown for a loop when his three older daughters buck the usual arranged-marriage traditions and choose husbands for themselves without his input...one marries the village tailor, another marries a young radical who is exiled, and the third breaks Tevye's heart by marrying a Gentile. And all the while, the country's anti-Semitic leadership is making ominous moves against the Jewish population...bringing about consequences that will change the lives of the villagers forever.



It may be America's game, but no one seems to know how or when baseball really started. Theories abound, myths proliferate, but reliable information has been in short supply—until now, when Baseball before We Knew It brings fresh new evidence of baseball's origins into play. David Block looks into the early history of the game and of the 150year-old debate about its beginnings. He tackles one stubborn misconception after another, debunking the enduring belief that baseball descended from the English game of rounders and revealing a surprising new explanation for the most notorious myth of all—the Abner Doubleday–Cooperstown story.


A professor moonlighting as a hit man of sorts for his city police department, descends into dangerous, dubious territory when he finds himself attracted to a woman who enlists his services.








Lunch & a Movie Monday, 7/22 starting at 12pm

Jesus Christ Superstar (1973)

Norman Jewison's second movie musical adapts Andrew Lloyd Webber's hard-driving rock opera. This version of the story gives a far more sympathetic role to Judas Iscariot (Carl Anderson), who fears that Jesus' growing movement will bring the wrath of the Roman authorities down on all their heads. In a misguided attempt to stave off trouble, he turns Jesus (Ted Neely) in...only to find that he may be a pawn in a greater plan than he ever imagined. As for Jesus Himself, He struggles with His own feelings of selfdoubt, fear, and questioning His destiny...and all the while, His disciples (including Mary Magdalene, who is trying to deal with her romantic feelings for Him) wrestle with their own role in the tragedy to come. With a driving, compelling rock score that includes the standout hits "I Don't Know How To Love Him" and "Superstar", this groundbreaking pop/rock opera illuminates the human side of the Passion.

These Savage Shores by Ram V (Graphic Novel)


Two centuries after the first European ship sailed to the Malabar Coast and made landfall at Calicut, the East India Company seeks to secure its future along the lucrative Silk Route, in the year 1766. An old evil now sails aboard a company ship, hoping to make a home in this new found land. But he will soon find that the ground along the Indus is an ancient one with daemons and legends far older than himself. Along These Savage Shores, where the days are scorched and the nights are full of teeth.

The Road by Cormac McCarthy

A father and his son walk alone through burned America. Nothing moves in the ravaged landscape save the ash on the wind. It is cold enough to crack stones, and when the snow falls it is gray. The sky is dark. Their destination is the coast, although they don't know what, if anything, awaits them there. They have nothing; just a pistol to defend themselves against the lawless bands that stalk the road, the clothes they are wearing, a cart of scavenged food and each other.

The Road is the profoundly moving story of a journey. It boldly imagines a future in which no hope remains, but in which the father and his son, "each the other's world entire," are sustained by love. Awesome in the totality of its vision, it is an unflinching meditation on the worst and the best that we are capable of: ultimate destructiveness, desperate tenacity, and the tenderness that keeps two people alive in the face of total devastation.

Remarkably Bright Creatures by Shelby Van Pelt






Jigsaw Puzzle Contest


